

### Report on Board Business – June 2020 Meeting Due to COVID-19 this meeting was held with participants attending in the home of the Chairman.

- No response has been received from local Councillor Peter Castaldo, regarding the problems caused by the Plane trees in Stradbroke Ave.
- The purchase of two bulk hand sanitiser dispensers was approved. These will be permanently
  installed at the club. One sanitiser will be installed at the entry double doors and the other near
  the entrance to the kitchen.
- Warringal Hospital has contacted the club requesting a meeting. The hospital is about to commence construction for expansion of the hospital. Discussion is likely to centre on parking arrangements. Further discussion at Board level will ensue.
- Approval was given for a funds transfer to the Terms Deposit account.
- Three people were approved for membership of the club.
- Recommencement of limited organised bowling activities has been well supported by members.
- Following consultation with members, it has been decided that there will be a submission to Bowls Victoria for three full teams for Saturday Pennant games and three full teams for midweek Pennant. It seems likely that the Club will submit a team for Tuesday evening competition. This may involve support from local bowling clubs.
- Due to COVID-19 the Winter Fours competition will not be hosted at the Club.
- It was decided that the Green generally referred to as the "bottom Green" will in future be referred to as the "John May Green". Appropriate signage will be installed.
- Approval was provided for the purchase of clocks and hands-free-waste bins near the Greens.
- It was decided to organise entertainment for the Christmas function pending compliance with COVID-19 restrictions at that time.
- Due to COVID-19 restrictions limiting bowling and social activities at the club, the Board decided to reduce subscription fees by one third for the 2020/2021 season.
- The defibrillators are to be serviced in readiness for the coming season.
- The Club's Handbook is being prepared for the coming season. Members are urged notify the Secretary of any changes to details to be published.
- The entrance wrought iron gate from Stradbroke Ave to the clubhouse is causing some difficulties. Rectification options are being explored.
- The AGM is scheduled for August 8, 2020. Compliance with COVID-19 restrictions at that time may mean innovative approaches will need to be considered.

#### **Bowls-related items**

Our nomination for three sides for Saturday and Tuesday Pennant has been submitted to BV. Part of the nomination process asked for feedback on the preferred format for the lowest Saturday Pennant Division, The options were sides of 12 or sides of 16. Based on discussions at the combined meeting of the Match Committee, selectors and our coach on June 13, our preference for sides of 12 players was communicated.
